Australian College of Emergency Medicine (ACEM)

The Australian College of Emergency Medicine (ACEM) sets the standards for clinical practice in emergency medicine in Australia and New Zealand. It is responsible for delivering and managing the training, education and professional development programs that serve to ensure the provision of emergency medicine care.

Entry requirements

- 1. You must have one of the following:
- An Australian or New Zealand primary medical degree, or
- Successfully completed the requirements necessary to obtain the <u>Australian Medical Council (AMC)</u> <u>Certificate</u>,
- or general registration with the Medical Board of Australia via the <u>Competent</u> <u>Authority Pathway</u>,
- or be a graduate in Medicine and Surgery of a Medical School recognised by the <u>Medical Council of New Zealand</u>.
- 2. You must:
- citizenship in the country of application or have been granted Permanent Residency status in the country of application, or the necessary visas to undertake training in the country of application.
- full general registration with the <u>Australian Health Practitioner Regulation</u> <u>Agency (AHPRA)</u> if applying for training in Australia, or with the <u>Medical Council</u> <u>of New Zealand</u> if applying for training in Aotearoa New Zealand.
- have completed the following as a minimum:
- One 6-month (FTE) ED placement that must have been completed: in a single Emergency Department where the applicant assesses and manages all types of patients in that Emergency Department (i.e. not only fast-track patients), in Australia or New Zealand
- entirely within the 12 months prior to your application, during or after PGY2, at a minimum of 0.5 FTE
- Your ED placement must NOT IN ANY PART be completed: at an Australian Urgent Care Centre
- of your six months FTE ED placement, no more than five weeks can be leave

- Three placements in three different disciplines other than emergency medicine, each of which must have been completed: as a minimum of eight weeks full time equivalent (FTE) of clinical work at a single site, exclusive of any leave, at a minimum of 0.5 FTE
- At least one of your non-ED placements must have been completed during or after PGY2. Non-ED placements may have been completed in PGY1 and/or overseas.

How to Apply

- There are two rounds each year and applicants may apply in either Round 1 or Round 2. Applicants may submit one application per year only.
- You must be in at least your third postgraduate year (PGY3).

Total Training Time

The FACEM Training Program is a five-year training program.

- Training Stage 1: A minimum of 12 months Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) training adult/mixed ED
- Training Stage 2: 12 months Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) training in ED
- Training Stage 3: 12 months FTE in ED
- Training Stage 4: Minimum six months FTE in ED
- Additional Training:
- A minimum of six months FTE training in non-ED (at any time during training stages 1-4)
- Six months FTE training in Critical Care (adult/mixed ICU and/or Anaesthetics) (at any time during training stages 2-4)
