

## Enabling Educator Excellence (E3) Scholarship



The Government of South Australia has established the Enabling Educator Excellence (E3) Scholarship for students commencing undergraduate or postgraduate initial teacher registration courses. 35 scholarships will be available per year for the duration of the funding.

### Eligibility

Scholarship applicants must:

- be an Australian citizen, permanent resident or permanent humanitarian visa holder; and
- be commencing the first year of an undergraduate or postgraduate degree at Flinders University in an initial teacher registration course that is accredited by the Teachers Registration Board of South Australia; and
- have a permanent home address in South Australia; and
- have not previously received this scholarship; and
- be able to demonstrate they meet one of the following applicant streams:
  1. High ATAR or GPA (ATAR 80 or above including bonus points or GPA of 5.5); or
  2. First Nations people (Australian Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander); or
  3. Women in STEM (enrolled in a major or minor that will enable them to teach STEM on completion of their degree); or
  4. Men in primary school teaching (men undertaking a primary school education qualification).

### Benefits

Each scholarship is valued at \$5,000 subject to maintaining enrolment in an eligible course. Payments will be made in two equal instalments after the census date of each semester.

### Tenure

The scholarship is awarded for 1 year of full-time study.

### Selection

Applicants will be ranked on the basis of academic merit (ATAR or GPA). Preference may be given to full-time students.

No more than 50% of scholarships will be allocated to any one program stream. No more than 60% of the allocation will be provided to postgraduate students.

Selection of the candidate(s) will be made by a committee comprising representatives from the College of Education, Psychology and Social Work, the Office of Indigenous Strategy and Engagement and Student Administration Services.

### Applications

An application for the course and subsequent enrolment in that course by the nominated deadline will constitute an application for the scholarship. Late course acceptances may be considered if the scholarship quotas have not been exhausted.
