WELCOME

Welcome to the 2025 One Year Honours in Psychology Domestic Application Guide.

Reading this Guide is the first step to applying for a Psychology Honours year at Flinders University. This Guide will help applicants determine their eligibility to apply and understand the application process. Information on the required supporting documentation is also provided in this guide. Reading and understanding this Guide forms part of the application process.

Flinders University's One Year Psychology Honours courses, accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) as a Fourth year of psychology, are:

- Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours)
- Bachelor of Arts (Honours)
- Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Honours)

The Psychology Honours year is offered on a full-time (or part-time equivalent) basis and is available for semester one commencement only. Offers are not deferrable.

We thank applicants for considering Psychology Honours at Flinders University.

* Official Academic transcripts must be submitted by applicants who have completed or are about to complete an APAC accredited undergraduate sequence in Psychology at institutions other than Flinders University.

ELIGIBILITY TO APPLY

Applicants must meet citizenship requirement, English language proficiency requirements and academic requirements to be eligible to apply.

CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Australian citizens, Australian permanent residents and Humanitarian visa holders are classified as domestic applicants. Applicants are required to meet domestic eligibility criteria at the time of application.

Applicants who are in the process of applying for permanent residency must have residency confirmed before they submit an application as a domestic student. Applicants who do not meet the domestic citizenship classification as above are considered international applicants and are not eligible to apply as domestic applicants.

Note: New Zealand permanent residents are classified as international students.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

Flinders University conducts an English Language Proficiency Check (ELPC) for all its courses to confirm applicants meet the minimum English language proficiency per English Language Proficiency Requirements for Coursework Award Courses and Topics Most applicants pass the ELPC due to having undertaken previous study in Australia at a higher education level. Applicants who may not pass the check will be contacted with further information.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must have completed (normally within the last ten years) or be in the final year of an APAC accredited 3year undergraduate sequence in Psychology at the time of application. Applicants are also required to have passed a minimum of one semester of full- time equivalent study in second year Psychology topics and one semester of full-time equivalent study in third year Psychology topics (the equivalent to 50% of a full-time academic load at each year level). All applicants must have also passed PSYC3007 Research Methods 3 (or its third-year level equivalent at another university).

MINIMUM GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

Applicants with a Flinders equivalent Grade Point Average (GPA) of less than 5.25 in second and third year Psychology topic attempts will not be considered for a place in Honours. A Flinders equivalent GPA of 5.25 is equivalent to 75% Credit and 25%

Distinction grades. Normally, a higher GPA is required. The specific minimum GPA varies from year to year depending on the applicant pool and the number of available places.

PLACES AVAILABLE

Limited places are available each year. Due to more applications received each year than places available, applicants are asked to note the GPA in second and third year psychology topics for selection for a place is likely to be higher than the minimum required to apply. This changes from year to year depending on the number of places and the applicant pool.

At least 80% of offers are made to graduates of one of the following Flinders University degrees:

- Bachelor of Arts (Psychology major)
- Bachelor of Psychological Science
- Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Psychology)
- Bachelor of Psychological Studies (Graduate Entry)
- Graduate Diploma in Psychology (Advanced)

Up to 20% of offers are made to non-Flinders graduates who have successfully completed or are about to complete an approved APAC accredited psychology sequence in their bachelor's degree.

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Sub-quota

Flinders University supports the participation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people in psychology through its commitment to equity and inclusiveness in its psychology program.

To be considered for the Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Sub-quota applicants must indicate they are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander in their application and submit the required supporting documentation by the deadline.

HOW TO APPLY

Applications are submitted directly to Flinders University through the <u>online application system</u>. For details on how to apply refer to our <u>Application Guide</u> or view our <u>instructional video</u>.

Applicants who wish to undertake the course on a part-time basis can choose this as an option when selecting the course in

the online application system.

Note: Bachelor of Psychology (Honours) (4 year) students should not apply for a one-year Honours, as they progress into Honours following completion of the first three years (providing that the academic performance requirements have been met) of this four-year APAC accredited degree.

WHICH COURSE TO APPLY FOR

Applicants who have completed or are about to complete one of the below degrees at Flinders University, or the equivalent at another institution:

- Bachelor of Psychological Science
- Bachelor of Behavioural Science (or who have a second major that is equivalent to one of the cognate (second major) areas in Flinders University's Bachelor of Behavioural Science)
- Bachelor of Psychological Studies (Graduate Entry) (or equivalent graduate-entry degree from another university)
- APAC approved Graduate Diploma in Psychology (Advanced)

Should submit an application to:

- Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours) application code HBPS
- Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Honours) application code HBBSC

Applicants who have completed or are about to complete a Bachelor of Arts with an APAC approved sequence in Psychology would normally apply for the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Psychology – application code HBA and should choose Psychology when choosing their Honours program.

Note: each applicant is considered equally irrespective of the Psychology Honours degree they apply for. Therefore, applicants are permitted to apply for only one of these courses. If an applicant submits more than one application the least relevant application as per the above will not be considered by the University.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

OFFICIAL ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPTS

Applicants who have completed or are about to complete their APAC approved bachelor's degree at Flinders **do not need** to provide Official Academic Transcripts unless some of their study was completed or is being completed at another tertiary institution, i.e. specified credit was granted for APAC approved study at another institution.

Applicants who have completed or are about to complete a 3-year APAC accredited undergraduate sequence in Psychology at another tertiary institution, **are required** to submit an Official Academic Transcript for these studies by the deadline. The transcript/s must show grades for completed studies so far in the course and must be provided in the online application. Please include a grading key (normally found on the back of the official transcript). Official Academic Transcripts must also be provided if specified credit was granted for APAC approved study at another institution.

An electronic original or a certified copy of an original Official Academic Transcript must be uploaded to the application by the deadline per the Application Timeline above, as evidence of meeting this requirement.

It is suggested applicants check with their institution how to obtain an Official Academic Transcript if they are unsure how to obtain one.

Note: Applicants who submit Unofficial Academic Transcripts, Australian Higher Education Graduation Statement (AHEGS), Statement of Results, exam slips, screen shots of grades, Enrolment List, Confirmation of Enrolment, etc will NOT be considered as these are **NOT** Official Academic Transcripts.

Applicants who do not provide Official Academic Transcripts by the deadline will **NOT** be considered.

My eQuals

If an applicant's Official Academic Transcript is available via the My eQuals platform, they can provide their URL link to allow access to the digital documentation in their application. If they have set a PIN via my eQuals (this is optional) they will also need to supply this. If they wish to set an expiry date for access to the digital documentation, they must ensure the date selected is **after February 2025** as the University may need to access the document up to and including this time.

For further information about sharing Official Academic Transcripts visit My eQuals.

If applicants receive further results and need to update their initial shared version of the document by the deadline, they will need to re-share the transcript with Flinders University in the My eQuals portal by the deadline.

Document authenticity through My eQuals

Some digital official academic transcripts specifically mention the University issuing the transcript will only guarantee the document's authenticity when it is accessed through a My eQuals link. They further state that when viewed online, the security of the document is only verified by the presence of the 'Certified' blue ribbon in the document.

Applicants who upload PDF documents from My eQuals that contain a blue ribbon stating 'Certified by (University)... all signatures are valid' in the Signature Panel in the electronic document may be accepted. However, if a printed copy of this document is uploaded to the application it will not be accepted as the electronic document normally states '(University) cannot verify this document's authenticity in printed format'.

Note: Official Academic Transcripts submitted in the format specified by the institution as not being able to verify the authenticity will **NOT** be accepted.

OVERSEAS QUALIFICATION ASSESSMENT

Applicants who are graduates with psychology degrees from non-Australian universities must have their qualifications assessed by the <u>Australian Psychological Society (APS)</u> for equivalence to an Australian program of study prior to submitting their application.

Information about the process for obtaining this assessment can be found on the APS website.

If official academic transcripts are in a language other than English, applicants must submit certified copies of both the original transcript and full translations in English. Translations must show results for all subjects undertaken and be certified by an independent accredited translator (NAATI) and feature the translator's original stamp and signature on every page. The translation must be a scan of the original hard copy translation document issued by the translator. Electronic versions of the translation, where the translator's stamp has been affixed electronically, cannot be accepted. It is an applicant's responsibility to comply with requests to provide further documentation, either in the original language or English translation.

ABORIGINAL AND/OR TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUB-QUOTA

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander applicants may confirm their Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander identity in one of two ways:

Confirmation of Indigeneity

Provide a certified copy of a formal document confirming their Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander identity. This should be from an incorporated Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander organisation stating the organisation recognises the applicant as an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander. This document should also contain the Common Seal of the organisation.

OR

Affirmation of Indigeneity

Applicants unable to provide a Confirmation of Indigeneity may complete and submit a current year Flinders University Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Identity Statutory Declaration available in this guide.

Note: Documents submitted after the deadline will not be accepted and applicants will not be considered for the sub-quota.

Applicants must upload all supporting documentation to their online application in one of the following file formats: JPEG, DOC, DOCX, or PDF e.g., transcript.pdf. Applicants must submit each academic transcript, statutory declaration, etc. as a separate file. There is a 2MB file size limit.

Only clear legible scans will be accepted. Only scanned copies of original or certified copies of documents are accepted. Mobile phone photos of documents will not be accepted.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection is based on academic merit – applicants are ranked for a place based on their Flinders equivalent GPA for their second and third year Psychology sequence topics only.

Limited places are available each year. Due to more applications received each year than places available, applicants are asked to note the GPA in second and third year psychology topics for selection for a place is likely to be higher than the minimum required to apply. This changes from year to year depending on the number of places and the applicant pool.

OFFERS

Offers may be made up until the commencement of the course in February 2025 to fill places available.

Offers are not deferrable and are only valid for the intake for which the application is made.

Note: Applicants who receive an unconditional offer will be required to secure their place by enrolling in at least one topic in the course by the deadline stated in their offer letter and maintaining their enrolment. Failure to enrol via the Flinders University Student System by the specified date, will mean the offer of a place in the course will be forfeited and their place may be offered to the next ranked applicant.

CONDITIONAL OFFERS

There are some instances in which an applicant may receive a conditional offer:

- A Flinders University 3-year undergraduate psychology sequence is due to be completed in late 2024 and the offer is conditional on successful completion; OR
- An APAC accredited 3-year undergraduate psychology sequence at another institution is due to be completed in late 2024 and the offer is conditional on evidence of successful completion through an Official Academic Transcript to be provided by the deadline stated in the offer letter; OR
- A minimum GPA must be met as stated in the offer letter and successful completion through an Official Academic Transcript to be provided by the deadline stated in the offer letter.

Conditions of an offer must be met as specified in the offer letter and by the stated deadline. Failure to do so will mean the offer of a place in the course will be forfeited and their place may be offered to another applicant.

Note: Applicants who meet the conditions of their offer will also be required to secure their place enrolling in at least one topic in the course by the deadline stated in their offer letter and maintaining their enrolment. Failure to enrol via the Flinders University Student Information System by the specified date, will mean the offer of a place in the course will be forfeited and their place may be offered to another applicant. Applicants who decline an offer for a place, will not be considered for another place or receive another offer.

THESIS SUPERVISION

Applicants who have secured their place in the course and maintain enrolment must attend an Honours meeting (attendance is compulsory). Students must be available on this date to attend Supervisor Topic Presentations and Interviews to determine their thesis supervisor.

Following the initial Honours compulsory meeting in February, students are required to consult with potential supervisors and discuss possible thesis topics. They can consult with up to six potential supervisors in individual consultations.

The discussions might begin with an idea from the student or from the staff member. Students are given a list of staff members' research interests and some possible thesis ideas at the first meeting.

Students submit a list of possible supervisors to the Honours Coordinator. Supervising staff similarly submit a list of possible students.

The Honours Coordinator allocates each student a supervisor by seeking to maximise the match between student and supervisor preferences.

External supervisors: With the approval of the Honours Coordinator, a person who is not a staff member in the College of Education, Psychology and Social Work may act as an external supervisor for the thesis. An internal co-supervisor will be appointed in such cases. In the past, joint supervision with an external supervisor has included staff at the Australian Institute of Sport, CSIRO, the National Centre for Education and Training on Addiction, and Flinders Medical Centre.

Although the majority of students usually receive their first choice of supervisor, this is not guaranteed, each supervisor has a maximum number of Honours students they can supervise.

Conducting research projects with participants from a vulnerable population group (e.g. school children under 18, people with disabilities, older adults in residential care) is generally not a good idea for an Honours project because of the challenge of gaining ethics approval and the often complex logistics of recruiting in such settings.

A Department of Human Services screening check will be essential for working with vulnerable populations. This should be arranged as early as possible by contacting the College of Education, Psychology and Social Work via <u>epswenquiries@flinders.edu.au</u>.

| Do I need to provide an official academic transcript? | If you are applying on the basis of a Flinders 3-year undergraduate psychology sequence, you do not need to provide a transcript. Applicants who have qualifications from other institutions must upload a certified copy or original official academic transcript by the deadline. Refer to the <u>Supporting Documentation</u> section of this guide for details. |
| Can I submit my official academic transcript via My eQuals? | Yes, you can share a My eQuals link in your application ensuring the expiry date is after February 2025. Further information can be found at <u>My eQuals</u> . Refer to the <u>Supporting Documentation</u> section of this guide for details. |
| How do I apply under the Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Sub-Quota? | Indigenous applicants can be considered under the sub-quota by applying the normal way. Applicants will be required to provide a completed Statutory Declaration confirming they are of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent by the deadline. |
| When will I be advised of the outcome of my application? | The outcome of applications, including offers for successful applicants will commence in mid-December and may continue until the commencement of the course per the timeline provided in this guide. |
| I was not successful in my application. Am I able to get more information on the outcome? | If you have been unsuccessful in your application it is due to the GPA achieved in second and third year psychology topics not being sufficiently competitive for selection of a place in comparison to the applicant pool. Advice on the outcome of your application will not be provided over the phone. |
| How will I be contacted about my application? | Communication regarding all aspects of the application is via email. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure they provide a current email address, regularly check their inbox (including the junk and clutter folders) and respond to any emails they may receive requesting further information. Applicants will be able to check and update their contact email address in the Flinders University Student System by visiting the My Details tab and selecting a preferred email address. Detailed instructions are available in the <u>Direct Application Guide</u> . |
| Can I defer my place to the next year? | Deferment of an offer is not permitted. If you are unable to commence the course in the current admission cycle you will be required to reapply in a future intake and a successful outcome is not guaranteed. |
| Are late offers made if places are available? | Offers may be made up until the commencement of the course in February to fill places available. |
| Can I study the course externally? | No, the course is only available to be studied on campus and in person. |
| What are the time commitments for the course? | The course is available on a full-time and part-time basis. It is normally expected students to commit at least 3 days a week for part-time study and 5 days a week for full-time study, depending on the grades they want to achieve. Part-time students would complete the course over 2 years with 4 topics to complete in the first year and the Thesis being completed in the final year of study. |
