

The Graduate Certificate is designed to meet the needs of practitioners working in disability, allied health and human services. It consists of 18 units and these can be completed on a part-time or full-time basis. Students complete one core topic and three electives.

Graduate Certificate of Positive Behaviour Support

The perfect platform for graduates looking to upgrade and extend their knowledge and skills in Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) for individuals with disabilities.

This course capitalises on the demand for capable PBS practitioners who can not only develop and implement PBS, but also provide PBS leadership to interdisciplinary teams. This growing space provides exciting career opportunities, with PBS being the recommended framework for providing behaviour support to individuals living with disabilities under the NDIS.

Master of Disability Policy & Practice

This masters provides advanced policy and practice knowledge, and skills which can be applied across the disability, allied health and human services professions. Students will develop advanced skills, specialist knowledge and expertise required of disability and allied health professions enabling them to work in a variety of government and non-government organisations in health, education and human service settings.

RESEARCH PATHWAY

This course has the same overall aims as the coursework pathway but also aims to equip graduates with the skills required to inform an evidence-based approach to research and practice. Eligibility for the research pathway is dependent on prior studies.

Midwifery

Graduate Certificate in Nursing

The Graduate Certificate in an area of specialisation consists of 18 units of core topics, including theory-based topics and professional experience placements topics. It is designed to provide you with the opportunity to acquire advanced knowledge and skills in specialist nursing, and to apply these in a range of healthcare environments.

Master of Nursing (coursework and specialisation)

The Master of Nursing allows you to specialise and will provide you with the opportunity to further develop your advanced, specialised theoretical and practical knowledge and skills in a focused area of nursing, and apply them in a range of situations. The course aims to enable you to contribute to the development of nursing and healthcare in your chosen field.

Master of Nurse Practitioner

The Master of Nurse Practitioner prepares you to be a clinical leader in your field. You will have the skills and knowledge to effectively integrate and apply interdisciplinary skills to plan, implement and manage health care programs and services.

You will acquire research skills and apply these to the resolution and improvement of health outcomes across a range of practice contexts.

Upon completion of this accredited course, you will be eligible to apply to the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA), for endorsement as a Nurse Practitioner by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia. * Course completion is only one of the requirements for endorsement.

The Master of Nursing (Coursework and Research) aims to provide advanced studies in nursing practice and research to prepare nurses to contribute to the present and future development of health care services and the nursing profession. The course is designed to enable practitioners to select a series of topics built on core material that will assist them to address particular needs within their practice and employment.

Master of Palliative Care

This Masters is designed to provide you with flexibility while aiming to deepen and extend the knowledge and skills required for practice in palliative care. It can be taken by coursework and a critical inquiry or research project. Topics cover areas such as communication at the end of life; oncology for palliative care; issues in the care of the spirit in palliative care; palliative care in aged care settings; palliative clinical management; suffering, futility and ethics in palliative care; understanding cancer; and design and ethics in research with vulnerable populations.



In the professional studies and communication sciences stream. the content is delivered via problembased learning tutorials. It involves working through a weekly case study in small groups facilitated by a tutor and followed up with independent learning, supportive lectures, and other learning resources. The case studies cover the areas of professional practice: speech, language, voice, fluency, swallowing and multimodal communication. These areas are considered in relation to lifespan development and socio-cultural context and how they impact health and well-being. The speech pathology skills and practice stream provide supervised workplace learning experiences throughout the course where speech pathology practice and skills are developed in real world settings. The research methods stream supports understanding of best practice principles and the development of a practitioner who is an informed consumer of research.

Graduates will meet the entry-level standards of Speech Pathology Australia, the national accrediting body, which will enable them to practice in Australia and to apply for mutual recognition of qualifications in many other countries and regions around the world, including the UK, New Zealand and Asia.









HIGHER DEGREES BY RESEARCH

Whether you want to explore a topic that interests you in depth, create new knowledge, foster collaboration or become an expert in your field, a higher degree by research at Flinders will help you make a difference.

Work with highly-qualified and recognised supervisors, connect with industry, government and the community, and contribute to the global research conversation. Higher degrees by research transform lives and make an impact with new discoveries, leading to better lives, better communities, better care and better systems.

Higher degrees by research provide training to foster the development of independent research and critical thinking skills which demonstrate the ability to pursue scholarly research that answers significant questions.

Flinders' research is highly regarded on the world stage: nursing and nutrition and dietetics research have been rated as above world standard (Excellence in Research Australia

ERA 2018) and Flinders University as a whole had 90% of all the research it does rated world class or above (Flinders rating 89.7%, rounded up to 90%. Excellence in Research for Australia, 2018).

We provide a wide range of opportunities to research the 'wicked problems' of modern societies. How can we enable people to lead better lives through self-care and caring solutions? How do we ensure dignified care for people with dementia, those that live with chronic disease and those receiving palliative care?

Exciting HDR opportunities are aligned to the ground-breaking Flinders Caring Futures Institute and our three research centres, the Research Centre for Palliative Care and Dying,

the Digital Health Research Centre, and the Torrens Resilience Institute.

Doctor of Philosophy

Undertake research training at the highest level. Produce a substantial body of original research that contributes significantly to knowledge and scholarship, leading to changed and saved lives. Flinders have a number of institutes and centres with exciting HDR opportunities that make a difference.

This PhD is a time-based research degree that can be undertaken either full-time or part-time.

MASTER OF HEALTH & CLINICAL RESEARCH

The Master of Health and Clinical Research program is an HDR pathway for professionals in any health field, giving graduates specialised knowledge and skills for research and is a pathway to studying a PhD.

The Master of Health and Clinical Research program is an 18-unit course of advanced coursework topics, as well as a time-based, supervised research project culminating in an externally-examined thesis.

Students who successfully complete the course will be eligible to apply for admission to a PhD.


