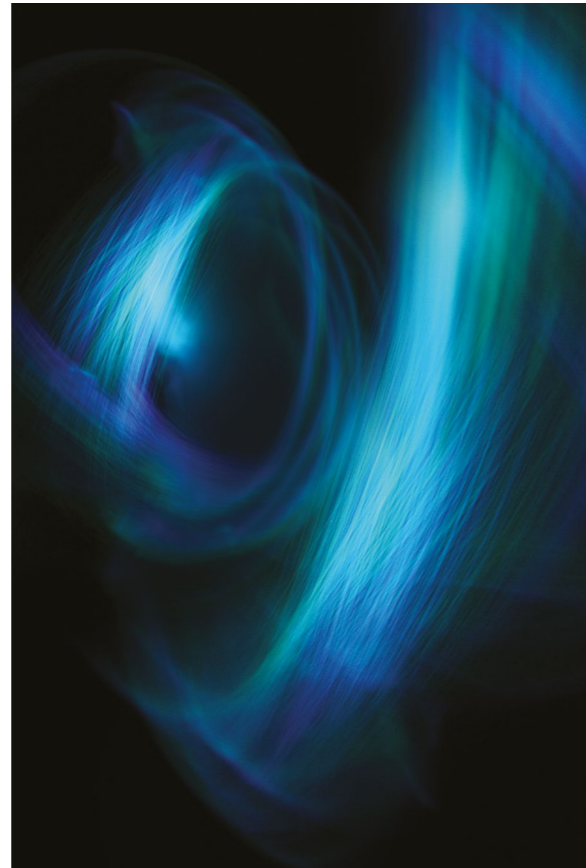

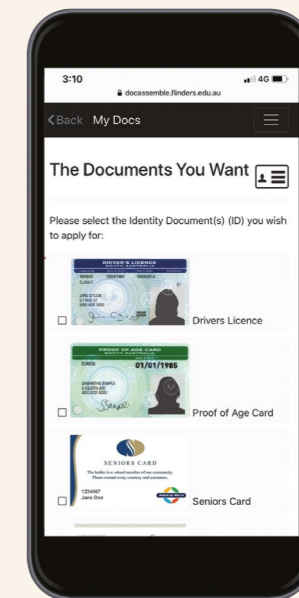

# Using future-focused legal skills to make an impact

Our law students developed an online app that aims to smooth the path into stable housing for some of South Australia's most vulnerable people. The project was part of our transformative Law in a Digital Age subject, and it's a rare opportunity to make a difference in the world.

Students Hannah Guest, Jocelyn Neumueller and Laura Spencer developed a Community Access Tool for the renowned Hutt St Centre, which advocates and empowers people at risk of or experiencing homelessness, as part of Flinders University's transformative Law in a Digital Age subject.

The new application allows Hutt St Centre staff to more effectively provide information on the services, amenities and facilities available in the communities that the centre's clients may move into. Currently, the Hutt St Centre Pathways program provides council packs to its clients when moving, which include useful information about the local services and support available. However, these packs cannot always be tailored to individual needs, and aren't available to clients who don't interact with the Pathways team.

To use the app, Hutt St Centre staff (or the clients themselves) first answer a series of questions to determine eligibility for certain kinds of assistance. The application then draws information from a database of council specific services for eligible clients.

The Community Access Tool is the result of a collaborative project within Flinders University's Law in a Digital Age topic. This subject brought together law and computer science students to help prepare them for the opportunities of an increasingly digital future.

Flinders University's Dean of Law, Professor Tania Leiman, says that Law in a Digital Age is a vital subject for anyone studying law.

"It's not just about the tech," says Professor Leiman. "It's about mindset – being innovative, being enterprising and being open to exploring the possibility of new solutions. It's also about using all the tools we have to make justice more accessible and available for more people in our community."

# PRISONS: HOW CAN WE DO BETTER?

Cooper Lawson, a Flinders Criminology student, explored ways of improving the corrections system in his Industry Project. It went so well, that the Department for Correctional Services offered him a job.

Criminology students have the opportunity to complete an Industry Project as part of their degree. In 2022, our students explored the creation of new environments and delivering rehabilitation programs more effectively, in a project involving the Department for Correctional Services.

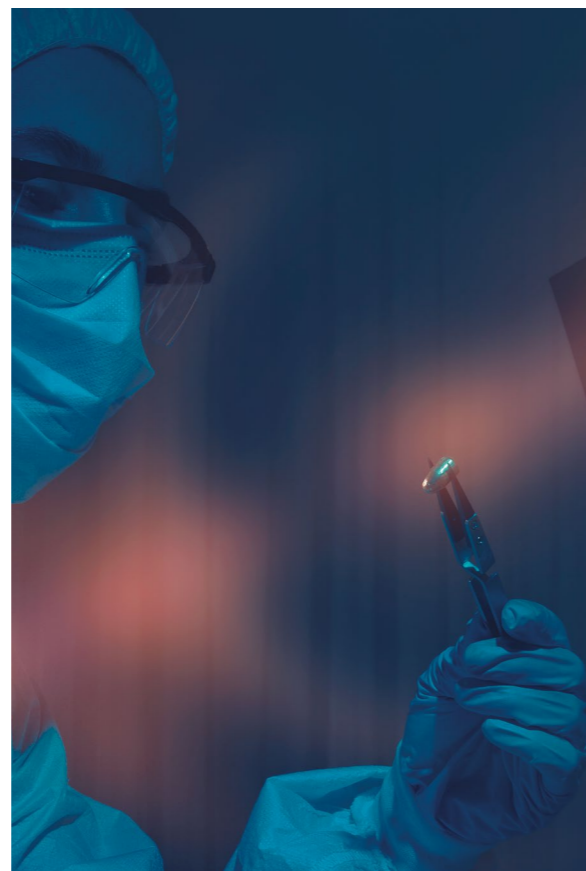
Representatives from the Department for Correctional Services said that the external view provided by students was immensely helpful in learning about the public's perspective on rehabilitation. It also helps the Department network with the next generation of public servants, who will one day make a difference to the lives of people who are impacted by the criminal justice system.

"It was really nice to be able to meet the industry project providers, and some of my future colleagues... I'm actually the first Aboriginal Victim Liaison Officer – this is a new role within the Victim Services Unit," says Lawson. "Being an Aboriginal student myself, I'm really excited to be able to engage with this, because that means that I can bring that cultural inclusivity, and those different conversations, into such a dynamic workforce."

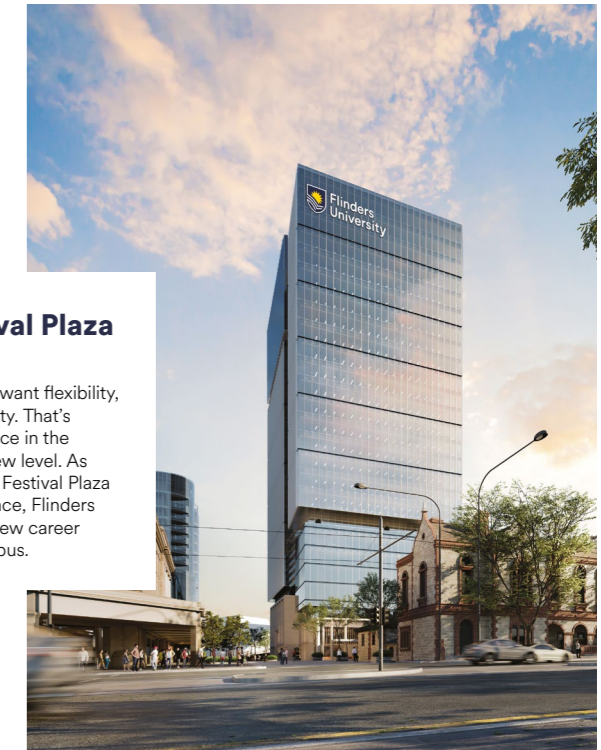

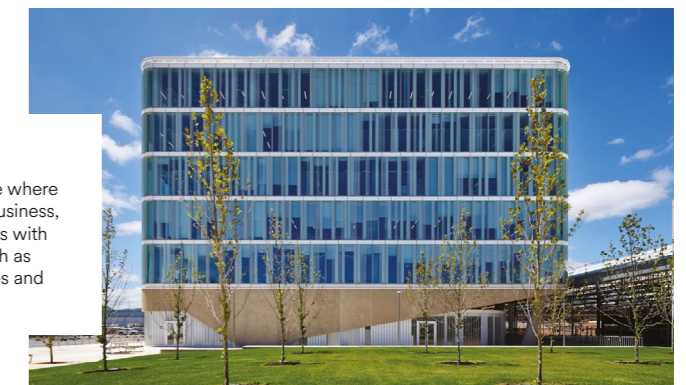

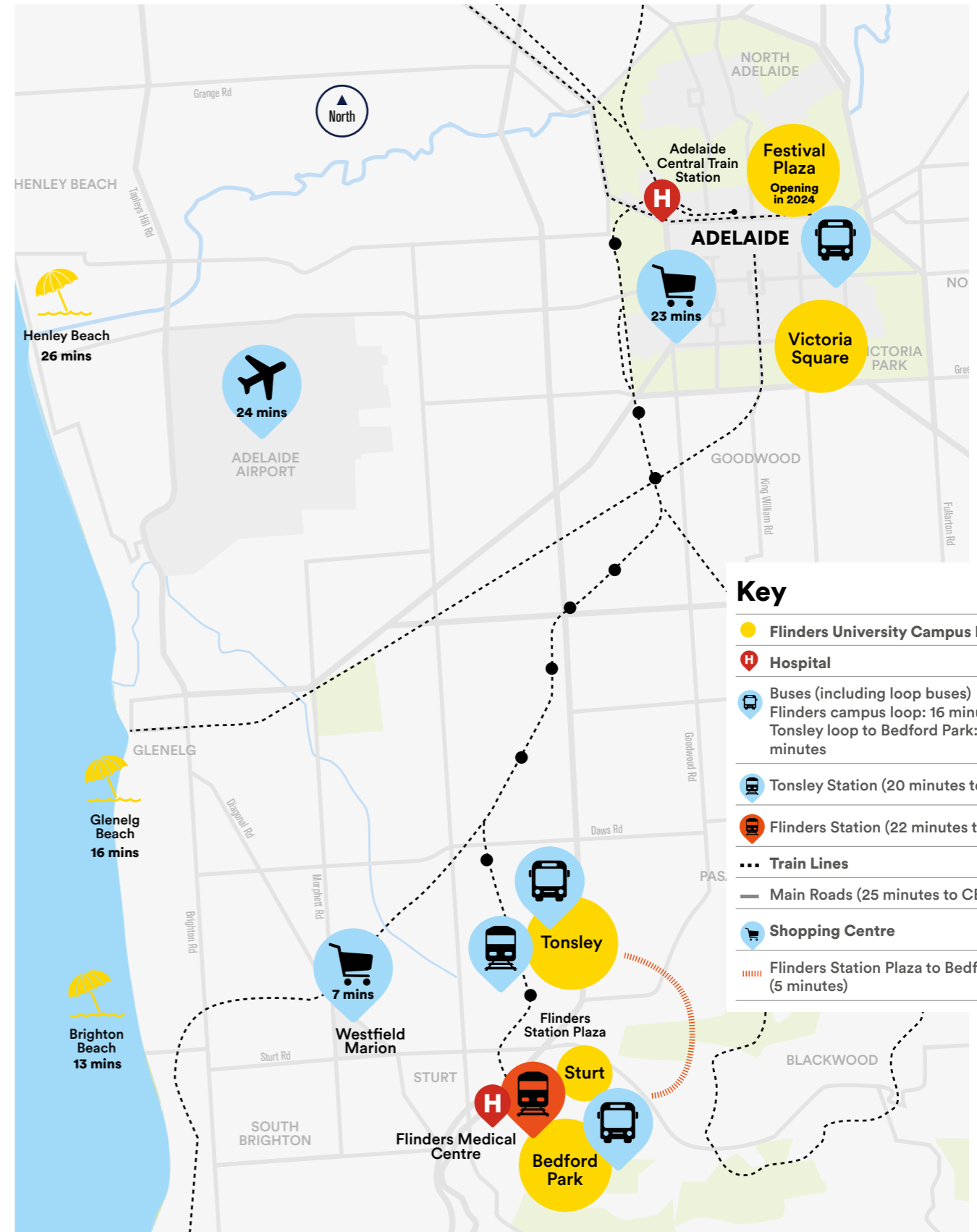
## A new link from the north

# Pathways to study

Whether you are a school leaver or returning to study at a later date, there are many ways to gain admission to Flinders University. Explore your options and find the entry path that's right for you.

## If you have secondary education

### Year 12 entry

Most Year 12 applicants enter university via the traditional entry method, where offers are made to eligible applicants with the highest selection rank until all places in the degree are filled. Your selection rank is used by Flinders to assess your admission to a course and is based on your ATAR plus any adjustment factors for which you are eligible.

### Guaranteed entry

If you achieve an ATAR equal to or above the published guaranteed entry selection rank (and you meet course prerequisites) you will be guaranteed a place at Flinders. We offer guaranteed entry for most courses.

### Indigenous Admission Scheme

The Indigenous Admission Scheme provides an alternative pathway for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, who may not have been able to gain entry to university by traditional means, with the opportunity to study at Flinders.

### Elite Athlete Pathway

If you've officially represented your school or state at a national level competition, we'll consider your school's recommendation about your academic potential when you apply.

### uniTEST

If you're in Year 12, uniTEST is available to enhance your chances of getting into Flinders. We will select students based on their Year 12 results (60% weighting toward the ATAR selection rank) and uniTEST results (40%). Flinders will also consider applicants based on their uniTEST results (100%) as a standalone entry score (subject to SACE completion and any course prerequisites or specific admissions requirements). If you take the test and don't do well, we will only consider your highest selection rank.

# Indigenous Admission Scheme

The Indigenous Admission Scheme provides an alternative pathway for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, who may not have been able to gain entry to university by traditional means, with the opportunity to study at Flinders.

## Are you eligible?

To be eligible for the Indigenous Admission Scheme you must be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person in accordance with the Commonwealth definition, which requires you to:

- be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent, and
- identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, and
- be accepted as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander in the community in which you live or have lived.

You may be currently studying Year 12 or be a non-school leaver.

## How to apply

1. Apply for the course you want to study through the South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre (SATAC). You will get an application number from SATAC that you will need for your Indigenous Admission Scheme application form.
2. Complete the Indigenous Admission Scheme application form online ([flinders.edu.au/indigenousadmissions](https://flinders.edu.au/indigenousadmissions)). If you are having trouble completing an online application, you can request a paper-based application via [ias@flinders.edu.au](mailto:ias@flinders.edu.au) or call us on 08 8201 3033.
3. An interview is part of the application process, but you will be notified about this.

## Application and interview dates

First round applications close late November and second round applications close early January for semester 1. For our midyear intake to a number of courses, applications close in June.
