IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Please note this form should be completed by applicants who are applying for entry to the Master of Physiotherapy (CRICOS code: 079421D)) at Flinders University. This form should be completed and submitted via email <u>(intladmissions@flinders.edu.au)</u> within 10 days of submitting their application along with supporting documentation.

Selection is based on meeting the entry requirements and academic merit (Grade Point Average). Should there be more eligible applicants than places available for the course, applicants who meet the entry requirements will be ranked according to their best Flinders equivalent GPA achieved over a minimum of one semester of full-time equivalent study in one course, and selection will be on the basis of GPA.

Applicants who are not successful in receiving an offer will be able to be provided with feedback on how to improve their chances for selection in the future if they wish to pursue a career as a Physiotherapist.

Applicants are advised that should they receive an offer for a place in this degree they will be required to accept their offer by a deadline stated in the letter of offer. If they do not meet the deadline, their offer of a place in the degree will be forfeit. Applicants who receive an offer for a place in this degree should also note that if they subsequently receive an offer to a higher preference, their superseded offer of a place in this degree will also be forfeit.

INSTRUCTIONS

Applicants must meet the following entry requirements to be eligible to apply:

Applicants must hold a Bachelor degree or equivalent qualification and have achieved a Flinders equivalent grade point average (GPA) of credit (5.00) or above to be considered. Applicants must also have successfully completed:

- the equivalent of 9 Flinders units (0.25 years FTE) of human physiology, including detailed exercise physiology; and
- the equivalent of 9 Flinders units (0.25 years FTE) of anatomy, including detailed musculoskeletal and neurological anatomy; and
- the equivalent of 4.5 Flinders units (0.125 years FTE) of study focused on an understanding of the human and social environment and social perspectives in health such as psychology and sociology; and
- the equivalent of 4.5 Flinders units (0.125 years FTE) study of research methods and/or evidence-based practice.

Applicants who did not achieve the minimum GPA in their completed Bachelor degree or equivalent qualification, can be considered on the GPA achieved in a graduate certificate provided they have completed a minimum one semester full-time equivalent study in this course. In addition, applicants can also be considered on the GPA achieved in a minimum of one-semester of full-time equivalent study or more undertaken in another Bachelor degree, graduate diploma or Masters degree of their choice, even if this course is not completed.

The equivalent of 9 Flinders units (0.25 years FTE) of		
anatomy, including detailed musculoskeletal and		
neurological anatomy. Topics must cover anatomy, and		
include detailed anatomy of human bones, joints,		
ligaments and muscles together with neuroanatomy (major		
neural plexuses, peripheral nerves and their area of supply		
to muscle groups and skin).		
The equivalent of 4.5 Flinders units (0.125 years FTE) of		
study focused on an understanding of the human and		
social environment and social perspectives in health such		
as psychology and sociology.		
Topics must cover broad perspectives of health and how it		
can be understood and influenced. This could be		
addressed by broad introductory psychology, sociology, or		
understanding health topics.
